Texas Independence Day

On March 1, 1836, a delegation gathered at Washington-on-the-Brazos to consider Texas independence from Mexico. A resolution calling for independence was adopted, and George C. Childress was appointed to head a committee of five to draft a declaration. Childress prepared a document that followed the outline and main features of the United States Declaration of Independence. The draft was unanimously approved on March 2. Ultimately, fifty-eight delegates signed the document. Thus was born the Republic of Texas.



History-Making Texan Award

The History-Making Texan Award recognizes outstanding Texans whose contributions to the state and the nation have been truly historic and exceptional in scope and nature. Honorees are selected for extraordinary accomplishments within their field and community and are recognized as having made a significant impact on the history of the state. The medallions being presented tonight were designed and created by James Avery Craftsman, replicating the Texas Independence Day Seal of the Texas State History Museum Foundation.
