Dear Mr. President:

The calamity in Liberia is a hanging question for America right now. As you make this decision, I urge you to come before the Congress to get a vote on deploying American personnel to Liberia and consider removing all US troops from the Balkans.

The decision to deploy US troops into Liberia needs to involve the whole country. It is a worthy humanitarian mission but unless the people are brought into the decision by their elected representatives, I fear our commitment will be superficial. Public opinion could then turn very, very quickly in response to the loss of US troops.

The United States will need to make some trade-offs to preserve our military readiness. Newspaper accounts report that the Department of Defense is repositioning 4,500 troops currently stationed off of the Horn of Africa. By contrast, we have committed 4,300 troops to the Balkans; 1,800 of those serving in the NATO Stabilization Force (SFOR) in Bosnia and 2,500 serving in the Kosovo Force (KFOR). Our European Allies can handle this situation and therefore, end our role in the Balkans.

Thank you for your great leadership. I pray daily for wisdom for you as you lead this country and much of the world.
