Connie Crook's Lemon Cake

for Mrs Laura Bush.

Beat together:

1 cube butter

¾ cup of sugar

Finely grated lemon from rind of lemons

*R.
12/11/08*

Add two eggs and beat more

Add ½ cup of milk and beat again.

Add 1 ½ cups of self rising flour – fold it into the mixture

Spray an 8 inch cake pan with PAM – preferably a pan where the base separates.

Put mixture into pan and cook in a 300 F. degree oven for 50 minutes

While cooking, squeeze two lemons and add ¼ cup of sugar and heat in a measuring cup standing in hot water so that when the cake comes out of the oven, the mixture is hot.

Remove cake from the oven, -- stand it on a small jar so that the side drops off, and immediately turn it on to a rack, and pour the hot lemon juice mix over it.

Will keep for a week on the shelf!

This is a recipe for Lemon Cake provided by Mrs. Connie Crook of North Wales, UK. She taught cooking at the nearby girls school, where she herself went to school with Jean Reddaway in their youth.

I prefer to use butter. 6 ozs of sugar is one 8 oz cup. 6 ozs flour is about 1 ½ cups. Note it is self Raising Flour which is available in US grocery stores. ½ tea cup is about 1/3 of an 8 oz cup. I use juice of 2 lemons. I pour the warm juice/sugar mixture into the cake as soon as I turn it out of the cooking tin on to a wire tray. The cake will keep happily for 5 to 7 days – but only if you resist eating it!
