

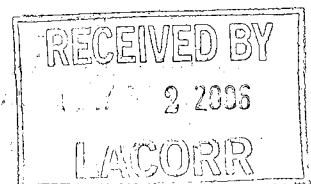

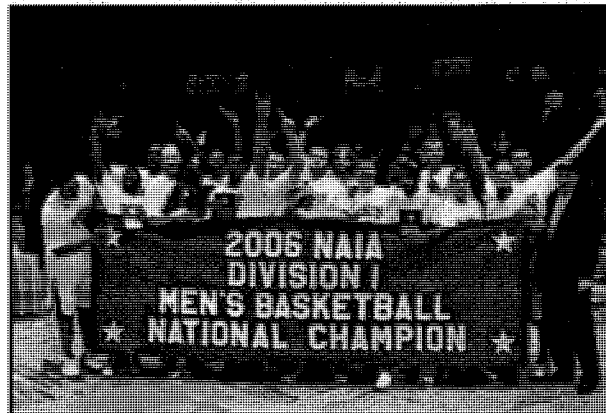


## IT'S ALL OVER! HUNT'S THREE LIFTS RAMS TO NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

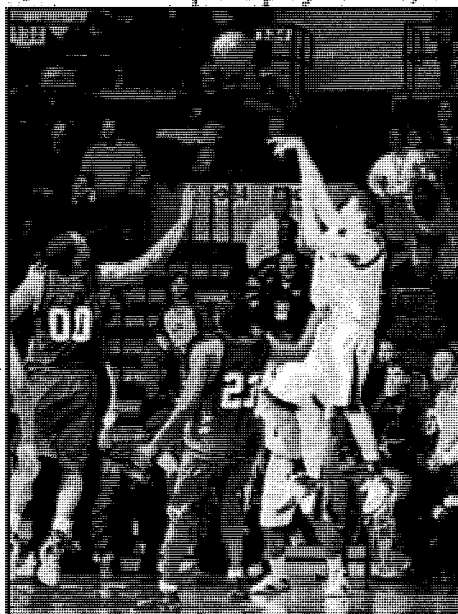

KANSAS CITY, MO:  
With 6.8 seconds on the clock, Oklahoma City's Rory Green went to the line for a one-and-one. Green hit the first, giving OCU a 65-64 lead. His second shot missed, and Ben Hunt grabbed the rebound, dribbled the length of the court, and hit a fall-away three with 0.2 seconds on the clock to lift Texas Wesleyan to its first ever National Championship.

"Coach drew up the play for me, and the rebound came right to me," Hunt said. "I knew that, with six seconds, I could dribble to a spot and put up a shot. That was unbelievable."



"It's so surreal," said Texas Wesleyan head coach Terry Waldrop, who was named the Rawlings-NAIA Division I Men's Basketball Coach of the Year following the contest. "These guys have amazed me all year, and I couldn't be happier for them."

The incredible accomplishment of this team may not set in completely for some

time. For the Rams, the 69th Annual Buffalo Funds NAIA Division I Men's Basketball National Championship was the culmination of two years of hard work from a core group that featured seven seniors this season.



At 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, the Rams met #7 Oklahoma City at Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City, MO, with the

National Title on the line. The Stars had been to the championship game four times before, winning titles in 1991, 1992, 1994, and 1996, giving them more NAIA National Championships than any other School. Meanwhile the Rams have been creating their own tradition. Texas Wesleyan had reached uncharted territory making its first appearance in the

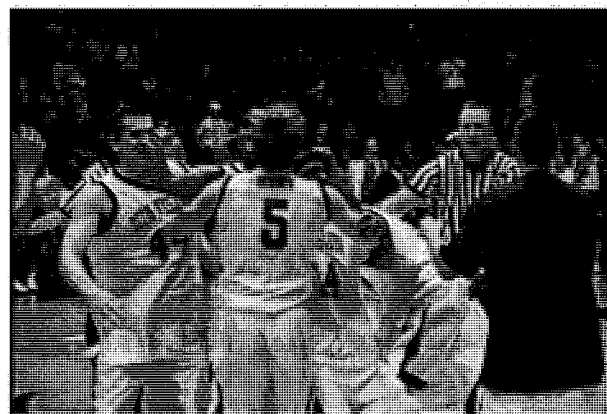


championship game in the 68-year history of the program.

The Stars featured Lorenzo Gordon, who was leading the tourney with 25.8 points per

game while Dawad Drew ranked third with 21.3. OCU was leading the tournament as a team with 90.3 points per game and a 15.3 average margin of victory.

In the first half, the Rams were clicking on all cylinders as they shot 54% from the field and hit on 6-of-10 three-pointers. Ben Hunt and Evan Patterson combined for



23 points in the frame, and Texas Wesleyan led 36-28 at the

break.

Oklahoma City would not go down without a phenomenal fight. The Stars opened the second half on a 9-1 run to take the lead at 40-39. The Rams recovered and took the largest lead of the half, 63-57, when Evan Patterson hit a pair of free throws with 2:11 on the clock.

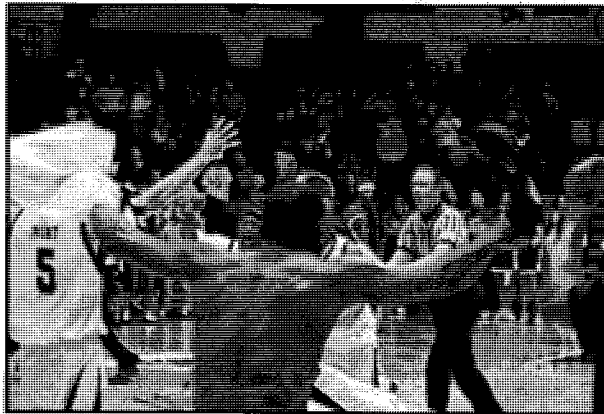


Again, the Stars battled back with a three and two free throws from Ryan Godwin to bring the score to 63-62 with 1:20 to play. Patterson and OCU's Trevor Meier traded

buckets before Rory Green drove the baseline and drew a foul with 6.8 seconds on the clock.

Green hit one-of-two; the basketball gods guided the rebound directly into Hunt's hands, and the rest is history.

Hunt finished with a tournament and career-high 34 points (including 21 in the second half) on 11-of-19 shooting including 7-of-11 from long range while



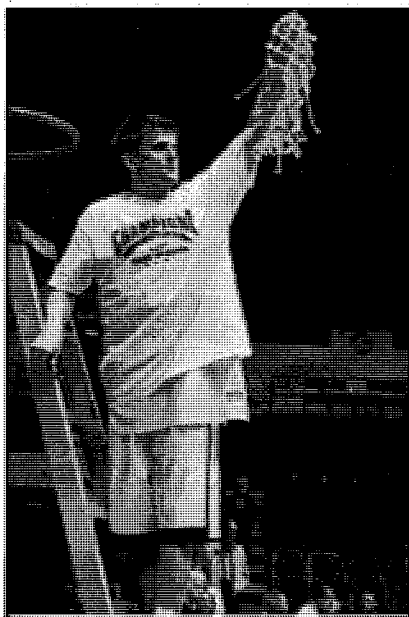
hitting on all five from the charity stripe. Evan Patterson, who was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player, added 14 points for the Rams. Both Hunt and Patterson were named to the All-Tournament team. All five OCU starters scored in double-figures led by Drew's 19 points.



The Rams hit on 10-of-17 three's and outscored OCU 13-5 from the free throw line.

The tournament featured the top 32 teams in all of

the NAIA. Only one of those tremendous teams was able to finish its season with a win. The greatest team in Texas Wesleyan University history was absolutely unstoppable, playing intelligent basketball with more heart, desire, and determination than any coach could ever hope for. Seven seniors finished their careers with a game that could only happen in one's dreams, and the 2005-06 Texas Wesleyan Rams will forever be remembered as National Champions.

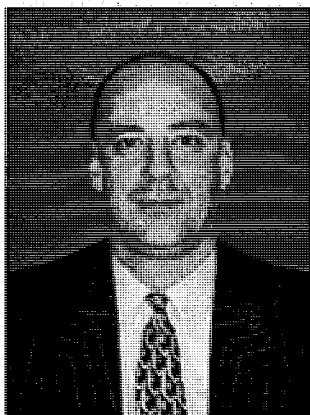

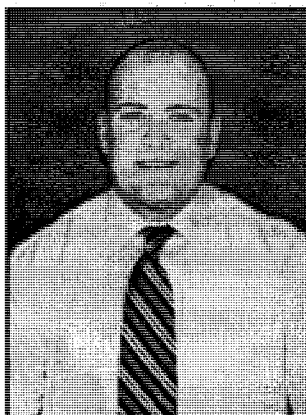

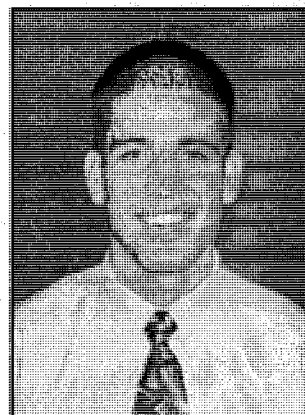

## Terry Waldrop, Head Coach

Waldrop begins his seventh season as head basketball coach for Texas Wesleyan. During his tenure, he has developed Ram basketball into a highly competitive program, improving the quality of play, opponents, recruiting, and national perception of the program.

Last season the Rams qualified for the conference tournament for the third consecutive year, going 21-12 overall and 15-7 in Red River Athletic Conference play. The team's 21 wins marked the fourth highest total in school history, while the 15 wins in the RRAC were the most in school history.

The 2004-05 Rams set 17 school records including most three-pointers made (348), most three-pointers attempted (865), and highest three-point percentage (.402). In addition, they led the nation in threes made per game with 10.9. They were led by 2nd-team All-American Tommy Johnson, who set a school record with 109 three-pointers, and 1st-team All-RRAC selection Ben Hunt, who set a school record and led the NAIA nationally with his 90.7% free throw shooting.

In the 2002-03 season, the Rams also finished the season with a 21-12 record. The squad included 6-10, Honorable-Mention All-American, David Johnson, who led the nation in blocked shots for two seasons.

In the 2001-02 season, Waldrop led the Rams to a 17-9 finish with a 8-1 home record, Wesleyan's best all-time home winning percentage. The Rams finished the year in the USCAA National Tournament in Detroit, advancing to the Elite Eight.

In his first season, Waldrop led the then-NCAA Division II Rams to a 15-victory season and the best winning percentage at Wesleyan in more than a decade.

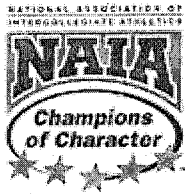

Junior Varsity Baseball and Junior Varsity Basketball have also been added to increase the participation opportunities for students at Wesleyan.

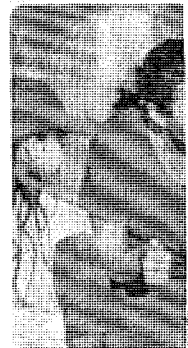
The Interim Director of Intercollegiate Athletics, is Mr. Kevin Millikan. The athletic department has a staff which includes an administrative assistant, sports information director, a faculty athletic representative and a head athletic trainer. Each head coach is responsible for several different activities including teaching, coaching, recruiting, scheduling, budgeting, maintenance, fund raising and team performance.

The athletic department is serviced by two student groups, the student trainers and cheerleaders. The student trainers are all in the academic major of sports medicine under the direction of Dr. Pam Rast. The head athletic trainer is Mr. Kyle Morgan. The student trainers service all NAIA and club sports by providing coverage for practices and game activities. The cheerleaders are a recognized student club on campus. Cheerleaders are selected based on tryouts and cheer primarily at men's and women's basketball games and provide organizational efforts for school wide pep rallies.

Texas Wesleyan University has been a member of the Red River Conference of the NAIA since the fall 2002. The member institutions are in both Texas, New

## About the NAIA

The association that would become the NAIA started in 1937 with the organization of a basketball tournament for small colleges. In 1940, tournament officials formally organized as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB). In 1952, the addition of three other sports prompted a name change to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The NAIA has always been a trailblazing organization – from racial integration to athletic opportunities for women. A strong focus on character development and academics is apparent in the organization’s programming and standards. The NAIA’s legacy of innovation continues, with the development of the Champions of Character program, which teaches key values in sports. NAIA academic standards require a minimum 2.0 G.P.A. on a 4.0 scale for all student-athletes. Our Champions of Character program, which was launched in 2000, addresses character issues more comprehensively than any other national program for youth.

Today, the Champions of Character program reaches 650,000 students in nearly 300 NAIA member colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada. Hundreds of NAIA students are recognized each year as All-America Scholar-Athletes, and thousands more are recognized at the conference level. The NAIA offers 23 championships in 13 sports – and helps all students prepare to be champions in life.
