


On June 26, 2006, the Beavers defeated the University of North Carolina Tar Heels, 3-2, in the third game of the CWS Championship Series and finished the 2006 Season as National Champions with a record of 50-16. After a disappointing showing in their inaugural visit to the CWS in 2005, the Beavers came back in 2006 only to lose their first game in the double elimination tournament. In an extraordinary effort the Beavers came back through the consolation rounds to make it to the Championship Series and win only the second team National Championship in Oregon State University history.


