I. PURPOSE

To receive the 2008 Bishop John T. Walker Distinguished Humanitarian Service Award and deliver remarks at Africare's annual dinner.

II. BACKGROUND

Africare

Africare is a leader among private, charitable U.S. organizations assisting Africa. Africare is also the oldest and largest African-American led organization in the field. Africare's programs are in the following broad areas: health and HIV/AIDS, food security and agriculture, water resource development, environmental management, literacy and vocational training, microenterprise development, civil-society development, and governance initiatives. Since its founding in 1970, Africare has delivered more than \$710 million in assistance to more than 2,000 projects in 36 countries across Africa.

2008 Africare Bishop John T. Walker Memorial Dinner

The Africare Bishop John T. Walker Memorial Dinner is one of the largest annual events for Africa in the United States. The proceeds from the event support Africare's mission to improve the quality of life in Africa. The Africare Bishop John T. Walker Memorial Dinner is held in memory of the late John T. 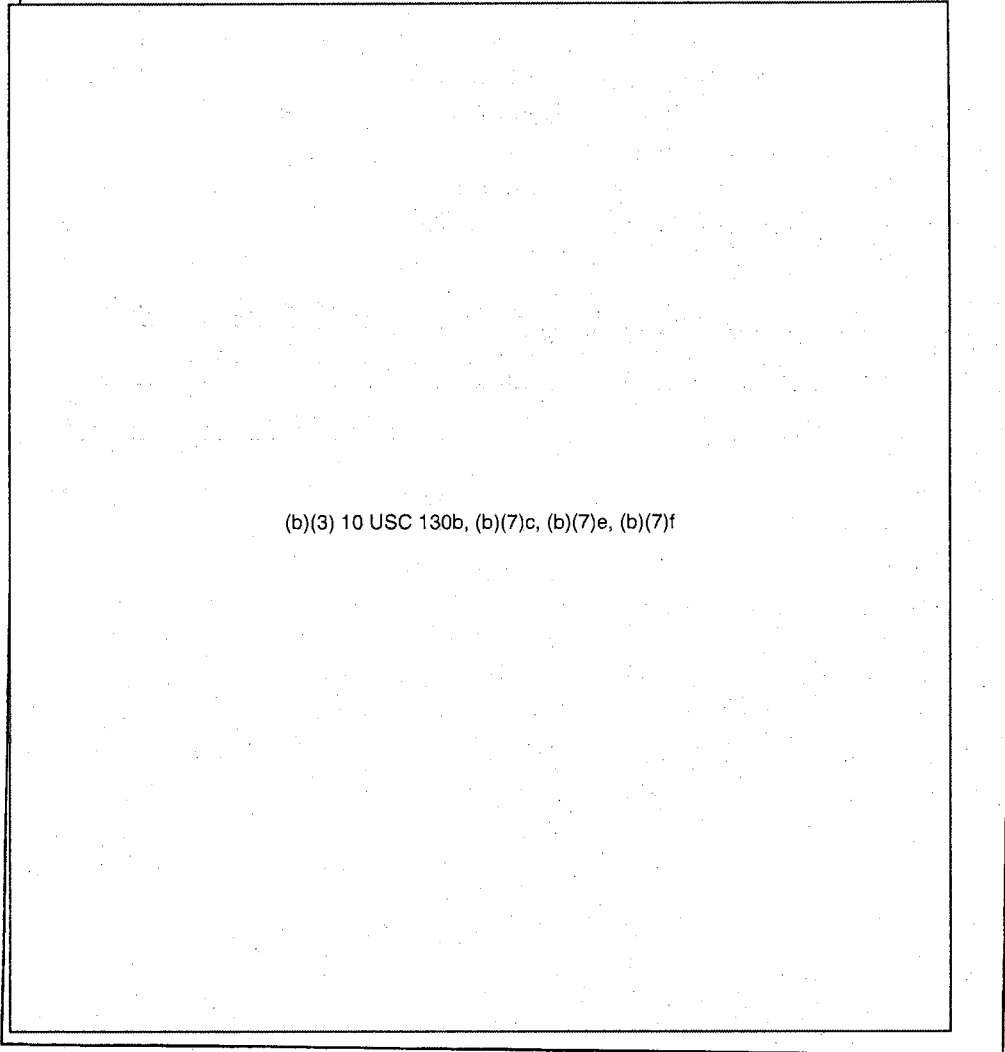
