BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON MEETING PARTICIPANTS

David Guernsey [GERN-zee], President and Chief Executive Officer, Guernsey Office Products, Inc. (Chantilly, Virginia)

David Guernsey is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Guernsey Office Products, Inc., an office products company based in Chantilly, Virginia, that he founded in 1971. Guernsey also serves as Vice Chairman of the National Federation of Independent Business. Mr. Guernsey supports the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act and believes the legislation will help to relieve uncertainty in the financial markets.

Note: David Guernsey participated in the August 12, 2008, Meeting with Coalition for Affordable American Energy at the White House.

Doug Guernsey [GERN-zee], Jr., Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, Guernsey Office Products, Inc. (Chantilly, Virginia)

Doug Guernsey, Jr., is the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Guernsey Office Products, Inc. Doug is responsible for managing the company's daily operations and is the brother of David Guernsey.

Gordon Thrall, Vice President of Sales and Marketing, Guernsey Office Products, Inc. (Chantilly, Virginia)

Gordon Thrall is the Vice President of Sales and Marketing for Guernsey Office Products, Inc. He has been with Guernsey for more than 25 years and has served in his current capacity for the past 11 years.

Len Adler, President, Adler Financial (Fairfax, Virginia)

Len Adler is the President of Adler Financial, a family-owned company, which he founded in 1976, that develops and manages commercial real estate in Northern Virginia. Mr. Adler indicates that current conditions in the financial markets are having a serious impact on his business, with vacancies in his buildings going up and non-performing loans increasing as well. Mr. Adler supports the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act and believes its passage is vital to reopening the flow of credit to businesses and consumers.

Mike Anzilotti, President, Virginia Commerce Bancorp (Arlington, Virginia)

Mike Anzilotti is the President of Virginia Commerce Bancorp, the holding company for Virginia Commerce Bank. Mr. Anzilotti has held his current position since 2004. Previously, he spent more than 30 years with First Virginia Bank. The company's core focus is real estate and construction lending. Mr. Anzilotti believes the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act will enable banks to raise capital and resume safe investment strategies.

Peter Converse, President and Chief Executive Officer, Virginia Commerce Bank, (Arlington, Virginia)

Peter Converse is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Virginia Commerce Bank, a position he has held since 1994. Virginia Commerce Bancorp has more than 26 different branch

locations in Northern Virginia with approximately \$2.6 billion in deposits. Mr. Converse also supports the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act because he believes it will help stabilize the overall financial market and thus strengthen bank assets.

Maria Coakley David, Chief Financial Officer, CJ Coakley (Falls Church, Virginia)

Maria Coakley David is the Chief Financial Officer of CJ Coakley, a commercial interior contracting company founded in 1962 by Maria's parents. CJ Coakley does not rely upon debt financing, but the company indicates that disruptions in the banking system have compelled it to find new banking relationships for its company. Ms. David is confident the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act will help improve market conditions, making it easier for banks to obtain credit and to improve relations with their customers.

Larry Horowitz, President, Velsor Properties (McLean, Virginia)

Larry Horowitz is the President of Velsor Properties, a family-owned business that he founded with his wife in 1997. Today the company owns approximately 50 commercial buildings and has more than 250 tenants across Northern Virginia. Horowitz reports that his company is currently seeing an increase in vacancies in his properties. However, he is optimistic that the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act will help people obtain credit, which he believes will result in an increase in rentals and will make it easier for his current tenants to pay their rent.

Gary Nakamoto, Member, Board of Directors, Fairfax County Chamber of Commerce and Northern Virginia Technology Council (McLean, Virginia)

Gary Nakamoto serves on the Board of Directors of the Fairfax County Chamber of Commerce and recently served as its Chairman. He also serves on the Board of Directors of the Northern Virginia Technology Council, which is one of the largest technology councils in the Nation. He is the Chief Executive Officer of Base Technologies, Inc., which he reports has been negatively affected by the current economic situation. Mr. Nakamoto is supportive of the Emergency Economic Stabilization Act and believes its passage was essential given the extraordinary circumstances surrounding the financial markets.

Todd Stottlemeyer, President and Chief Executive Officer, National Federation of Independent Business (Washington, D.C.)

Todd Stottlemeyer is the President and Chief Executive Office of the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB), the largest small business advocacy group in the country. Mr. Stottlemeyer has held this position since 2006. Founded in 1943, NFIB represents more than 600,000 small businesses in every State in the country. The NFIB advocated for the recent Emergency Economic Stabilization Act legislation.
