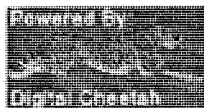
We are here for the long haul. We are the caretakers for permanent funds that will long outlive their donors, our current staff and the Foundation's current Board of Governors. They have changed since our first named endowment fund was created in 1978 by John Simpson in honor of his wife, Mary Neighbors Simpson, but in the years since, we have made grants in excess of the amount of the original gift while preserving principal for the next generations.

We expect that living donors will create funds designed to last well into the future. More than someday the need for the fund passes, our Board of Governors will find the nearest possible use for the money by applying the variance power set forth in our Articles of Incorporation. For example, help prevent polio might today be used for research on multiple sclerosis - so donor can be assured that their charitable wishes will also be permanently fulfilled.

CONVENIENT

It can take less than an hour to create a fund in the Austin Community Foundation, and with us after the fund is created could not be simpler.

Each donor who creates a fund may define its charitable purposes and determine the fund's name. The name can honor family or friends, or protect anonymity. We monitor the investment



grants from the earnings, and handle all the paper work.

FLEXIBLE

Thomas Jefferson once said that he deemed it "the duty of every man to devote a certain portion of his income for charitable purposes." But Jefferson left wide open the purposes any person can choose because there are as many types of good works as people on this earth.

So we make it easy for people to support good works of their own choice. Donors may support general charitable goals of our community foundation that address the well being of the surrounding areas. Or they may ask us to support certain causes, such as assisting the giving a scholarship to a graduate of an area high school. Some name particular charities that have impressed them and other choose to advise us of their changing inclinations from year to year.

GEOGRAPHICALLY FOCUSED

It's our idea that those close to home know home best.

Community foundations like ours focus on a local area where we can get to know every need, every arts group, every street corner and neighborhood. That way, we know where our donors' gifts so they do the most good.

Donors particularly benefit from this expertise when they adopt our general goals or choose a broad field of interest for their fund. Grants from these funds are spent in our home territory where we can monitor changing conditions and respond to emergencies.

Other donors specify certain charities they wish us to support with their funds. They benefit from our ability to monitor the charities' performance for generations into the future, ensuring that donors' funds will continue to meet the purposes for which they were intended.

Donors may recommend grantees outside our region provided that they qualify as 501(c)(3) charities and have been incorporated within the United States (grants outside of the United States may qualify with certain restrictions).

ECONOMICAL

If each individual fund had to recreate our services from scratch, the price tag would be high. But each fund shares the cost of an outstanding staff and superb investment advisors. It's the services of a growing \$30 million foundation to donors whose funds total as little as \$10,000 after three years.

We charge minimal fees. Our Board periodically reviews these fees to assure they are reasonable while meeting the Austin Community Foundation's expenses. Currently, the Austin Community Foundation charges endowment funds a pro rata portion of all investment income plus an administrative fee equal to five percent (5%) of the income allocated to the fund. "Project" or "pass-through" funds are not charged any fees, however, any interest that is earned on such funds shall belong to the Austin Community Foundation.

FIDUCIARY RESPONSIBILITIES

Among the Austin Community Foundation's fiduciary responsibilities, none is more important than the prudent investment of its assets.

The Investment Committee of the Foundation is composed of astute financial manager and business people from the Board of Governors. This committee sets investment policy and oversees the performance of the investment managers who are reviewed quarterly. In

managers are instructed to preserve endowment principal as the primary objective while income and long term capital appreciation are secondary objectives. Money managers are evaluated by the Investment Committee on portfolio performance and strategy.

Some contributors of mid-size and larger funds request a different investment scenario. The Investment Committee may agree to carry out, considering the best interests of the Foundation. For example, trust departments of our local banks and a donor's own money manager are the money managers for several of our funds.

The Foundation has achieved a very satisfactory total return on its funds since its inception. Each fund is credited with its proportionate income and market adjustment every month as well as assessed its share of investment and administrative expense, which is quite low and very competitive.

WELL-GOVERNED

The Board of Governors of the Austin Community Foundation provides stewardship over contributed funds. Serving without compensation, the Governors approve all grants and monitor investment performance and oversee the operation of the Foundation.

The men and women who make up our Board of Governors represent Austin's most distinguished civic and business leaders. Collectively, they offer extensive knowledge of our region and a wealth of experience in institutional management, law, finance and philanthropy. Each Governor serves a maximum of two three-year terms.

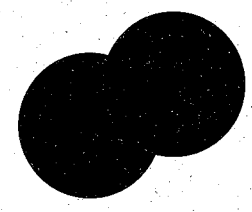
