Last week America was viciously attacked. Thousands of Americans were killed – and thousands of others were badly wounded. Without prompting or prodding, Americans responded immediately and overwhelmingly. Tens of millions of dollars, thousands of hours, and tons of food and clothing have been donated to help rebuild shattered lives. Americans' love for America was channeled through our Nation's great charities. In the week since the attack, our compassionate and generous citizens have led the first phase of our war on terrorism: They have sustained and strengthened the homefront.

Today I'm joined by representatives of charities bringing relief to our fellow Americans affected by the attacks on New York and the Pentagon, and the crash in Pennsylvania.

These good citizens represent large national charities like the American Red Cross, the Salvation Army, and the United Way; as well as community-based groups such as firefighter and police associations, local businesses, and faith-based and non-profit groups. Large and small, these important charitable efforts are saving lives and restoring hope.

I'm also joined by Governor George Pataki's wife, Libby Pataki; Tony Carbonetti, Chief of Staff to Mayor Rudy Giuliani; Governor Jim Gilmore; and Governor Tom Ridge. The Governors and Mayor Giuliani have shown impressive leadership in the wake of the attacks on their citizens.

They have put their public agencies on full alert to provide immediate assistance to victims and their families. They have called on the men and women of the National Guard to help maintain order and calm in a potentially chaotic situation. And they have led and supported valiant rescue workers in New York City and Northern Virginia, whose bravery is seared into our national consciousness.

Mayor Giuliani and Governor Pataki have led New York through its most difficult days, and they have done so with dignity, pride, and courage. The Mayor, the Governor, and all New Yorkers have demonstrated the very

best American values to a watching world. And all Americans have gained confidence from their strength.

Last evening marked the start of Rosh Hashanah. In Jewish teaching, this holy day is the anniversary of the creation of the world. It is a season of renewal and of hope, and people of every faith, all across America, are embracing that spirit.

Funds in New York and Washington are providing food, clothing, and financial help to husbands and wives who have lost their spouses, and to children who have lost their parents. Citizens near Ground Zero in New York have provided sandwiches, drinks, and clean clothes to tired, hungry rescue workers. And in one of America's greatest traditions, a handful of young entrepreneurs at a lemonade stand in Springfield, Virginia, collected over \$600 for the American Red Cross. But challenges remain, and these good efforts need our great support.

People all over the country are asking how they can bring hope and healing to their fellow Americans. There are many ways to contribute – through local stores and businesses, national media organizations, and internet portals. Many of the charities themselves welcome donations through their web sites. As of yesterday, Americans had contributed more than \$50 million to relief efforts through online donations.

Some of America's high-tech leaders – AOL Time Warner, Microsoft, Amazon, eBay, Cisco Systems, and Yahoo – have joined together to encourage online giving, and to bring resources and information to concerned citizens. The American Liberty Partnership – with its web site, "LibertyUnites.org" – will link Americans who want to help victims of last Tuesday's attacks and their families with the national and local organizations that are providing support.

By visiting "LibertyUnites.org", or relief agency web sites, Americans can make an online donation that will reach people in any part of the country where families are suffering. They can see what other items – food or clothing or blood – individual charities need. Or they can find out how best to donate their time and their talent to the relief effort.

It's important for Americans to realize that some charities have been temporarily overwhelmed by the public's response – but they may need

more help in the future. I urge Americans to find out how they can help in the weeks and months ahead.

Once again, Americans have shown the world the qualities that make us a great Nation and a great people: compassion, courage, unity, and resilience. Together, we will help those in need, prevail against the forces of evil, and work in partnership to protect American liberty.

#### **What is the American Liberty Project?**
