Prior to joining Seligman in 1985, Mr. Kadlec was Executive Vice President and Director of Research at A.B. Laffer Associates, an economic consulting firm based in San Diego, California. Previously, he was a partner in H.C. Wainwright & Co., Economics, in Boston, an officer of Crocker National Bank in San Francisco, and a contributing editor to *Business Week* magazine in New York. He received his MBA with honors from the University of Chicago.
