**^Peres, Arafat to meet Tuesday in Israel, government official says**

JERUSALEM (AP) Israeli Foreign Minister Shimon Peres and Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat will meet Tuesday, despite a series of attacks by Arab militants, a senior Israeli government official said.

The meeting will take place in Israeli territory, said the official, who spoke on condition of anonymity. One possible venue is the Erez crossing between Israel and the Gaza Strip, which has Israeli- and Palestinian-controlled sections.

The Palestinians had initially insisted that the meeting take place in Egypt, but Israel rejected the demand.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESS SECRETARY

Export Administration Act (EAA)

The President commends the Senate for its decisive action to pass the Export Administration Act of 2001 (S. 149). This bill is a key part of the President's national security, high technology and trade agenda. President Bush recognizes that we are using an outdated system designed to handle Cold War concerns that does not meet our current national security needs -- the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and terrorism.

S. 149 will give the President the tools he needs to modernize the U.S. export control system so that it focuses on truly strategic goods and technology, not items that are widely available from many sources. S. 149 will enable the United States to meet its national security goals, while letting American companies compete effectively in the world marketplace. The President looks forward to the House acting swiftly to send this legislation to him for signature.

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
