To call my role in the Presidential Inaugural Parade "modest" would be an overstatement, but this particular TV game show host was very proud to be a part of it.

You are, of course, receiving advice--most of it unsolicited--from writers, pundits, politicians, and citizens of all stripes. I have no advice for you. I voted for you proudly because you seemed to be a man of conviction and courage, of wisdom and common sense, and, perhaps most of all, a man comfortable in his own skin and not at all convinced that the Republic would wither and die if he were not elected.

The pressures and responsibilities of the Presidency make me wonder why anyone would aspire to it, but I am profoundly grateful that you did. I wish you and Mrs. Bush much happiness and success during your term and beyond.

If I may, I'd like to share one anecdote. My wife, Lesly, and I were thrilled to be invited to a State Dinner during your father's term, and, during the small talk which followed, he was kind enough to ask how my show was doing. This was just after Desert Storm, when his approval numbers were around 90%. "Everything is fine, Mr. President, but I wish we had your ratings."

His reply was, "Don't worry. Mine will go down sooner than yours."

It was said without malice or self-pity, but with the matter-of-factness of a man also comfortable with himself and not at all self-deluded by the trappings of his office.

There is a great deal of him in you. And I mean that as a high compliment.

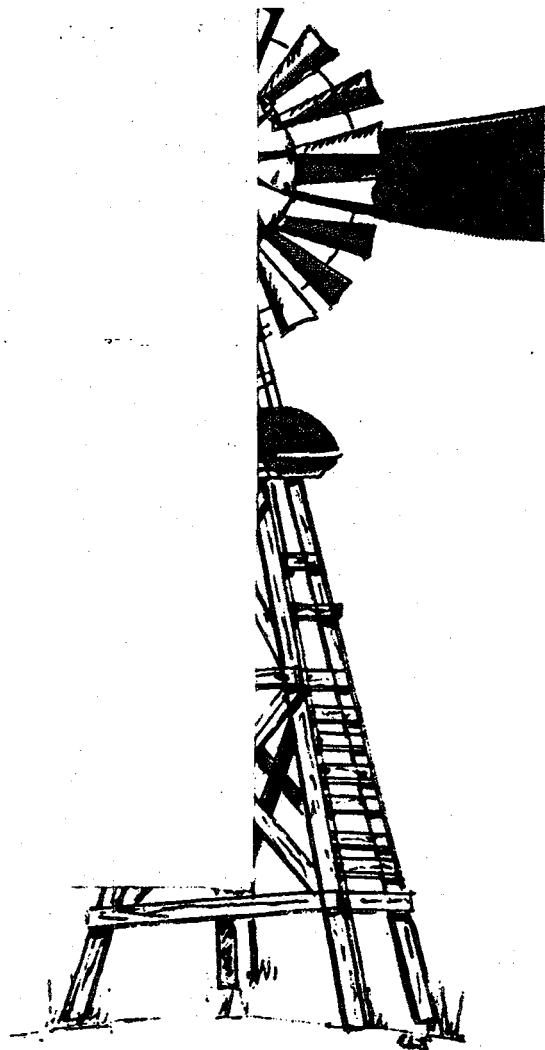

Dear Mr. President:

I was pleased I could attend your inauguration and want to formally convey my congratulations and best wishes as you begin your term of office as President of the United States.

As I begin my second term as Indiana's governor, I share your focus on education as an issue of paramount importance. Raising standards and improving performance in our nation's schools is not only essential to the continued growth of our country's economy, but is also the key to assuring that all Americans obtain the skills necessary to compete for jobs and assume personal responsibility for themselves and their families.

During my first four-year term, with bipartisan help and input from the Indiana General Assembly, our separately elected Superintendent of Public Instruction, business leaders, parents, and teachers, we made significant progress in raising our state's education standards and establishing meaningful benchmarks for student performance. We have now successfully implemented a statewide high school exit exam, adopted new content standards that are among the strongest in the country, widely promoted character education as an essential learning component, and expanded the use of school report cards to inform parents of their children's educational progress. We have also implemented, on a voluntary basis, a reading diagnostics assessment that is helping local school officials implement early intervention strategies.

While our task in Indiana is far from finished, I am very hopeful we can work with your administration to increase federal support for education while also ensuring more state and local accountability for federal investments. I therefore look forward to collaborating with you, U. S. Secretary of Education Roderick Paige, and the entire Indiana congressional delegation in the months ahead. I also would like to invite you and


Secretary Paige to visit Indiana to see firsthand the progress we are making in raising expectations for student achievement and implementing real accountability measures.

During the next several years, states such as Indiana will continue to also face challenges in paying for the cost of public health services and compliance with federal environmental laws. I am also eager to explore ways to improve federal-state cooperation in these areas with the nominees you have selected to head the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the Environmental Protection Agency, Governors Tommy Thompson and Christine Whitman, two of my respected colleagues.

In addition to the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), which requires your administration's immediate attention, the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA) and the Transportation Efficiency Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) are both due to expire in the next several years. As you know, these two landmark pieces of legislation have had significant implications for state budgets and policy and I urge you to also make their reauthorization important priorities.

As you balance the important responsibilities you must carry out as both our nation's chief executive and commander in chief, I urge you to build upon and strengthen the many existing federal-state partnerships that are such an essential part of our governing system. As Governor of Indiana, I pledge to you my cooperation and good will toward achieving this end.
