Politics: In his six statewide races, Senator Bond has defeated his opponent by more than 10 percent only once, in 1980. In 2000, Senator Bond lost a bid for Chairman of the Senate Republican Conference to Senator Santorum by a vote of 30 to 20.

Legislation: Senator Bond introduced legislation to double, over five years, Federal investment in programs that provide health care services to uninsured and low-income individuals in medically underserved areas. It also allowed a deduction for 100 percent of the health insurance costs of self-employed individuals. During Bond's 1998 reelection campaign, he championed Direct Check, a program by which Federal dollars would be directed to local schools, thereby returning decision-making and money to parents, teachers, and local school districts. Bond is very interested in early childhood development programs.

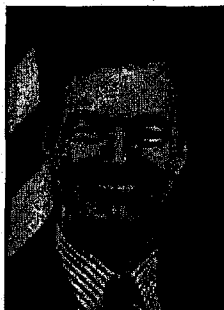

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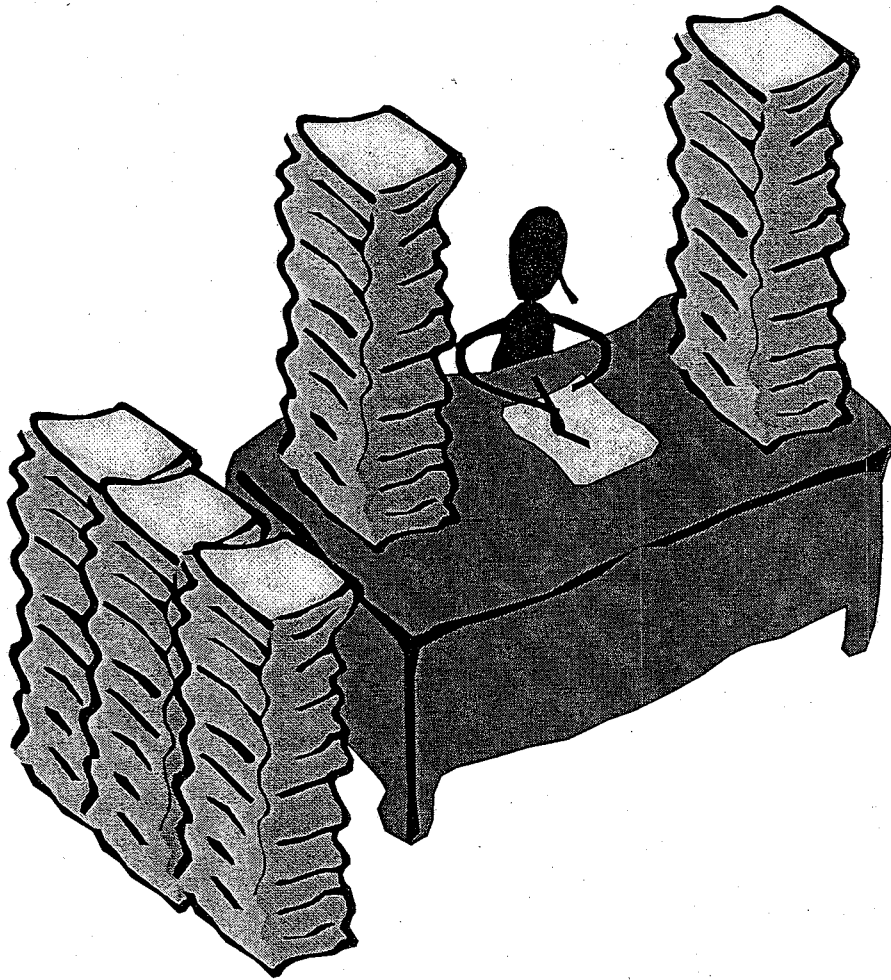
