Bishop praises president for anti-AIDS stance

Bishop Joel N. Martinez commended President Bush July 15 for making AIDS prevention and treatment a major priority during his July tour of Africa.

In a joint letter with the Rev. R. Randy Day, chief executive of the United Methodist mission board, Martinez expressed appreciation for a U.S. commitment of \$15 billion to fight AIDS in Africa.

Martinez of San Antonio is president of the New York-based General Board of Global Ministries.

The bishop and Day told the president about the extensive anti-AIDS work being done by the denomination.

"Our United Methodist Church—your church—has struggled with the AIDS crisis in Africa for many years," they wrote. "We have been particularly attentive to the impact upon mothers and children.

"Our programs deal with AIDS education, prevention and patient treatment. Our organizations and congregations in Africa are active in service provision.

"We have also recruited and equipped short-term mission personnel to assist in programs of AIDS education and patient care."

United Methodists have contributed almost \$8 million to a special "Hope for the Children of Africa" fund that includes health concerns, the two told Bush.

The letter noted that Radio Africa International, a service of the General Board of Global Ministries, includes programming on AIDS and other health issues.

In addition, the mission board's Website includes a special section on AIDS in Africa, they said.

Martinez and Day urged the president to assure that the U.S. AIDS funds are distributed in a broad and equitable way in Africa to achieve humanitarian objectives.

The United Methodist missions leaders said they hoped the U.S. government would use the skill of nonprofit and faith-based organizations in the work against AIDS in Africa.

The mission board stands ready to be a partner in achieving the humanitarian objectives of the AIDS program Bush has initiated, they said.

United Methodists can make contributions to fight AIDS in Africa by dropping checks marked "Hope for the Children of Africa" (Advance No. 101000) into local church offering plates.
