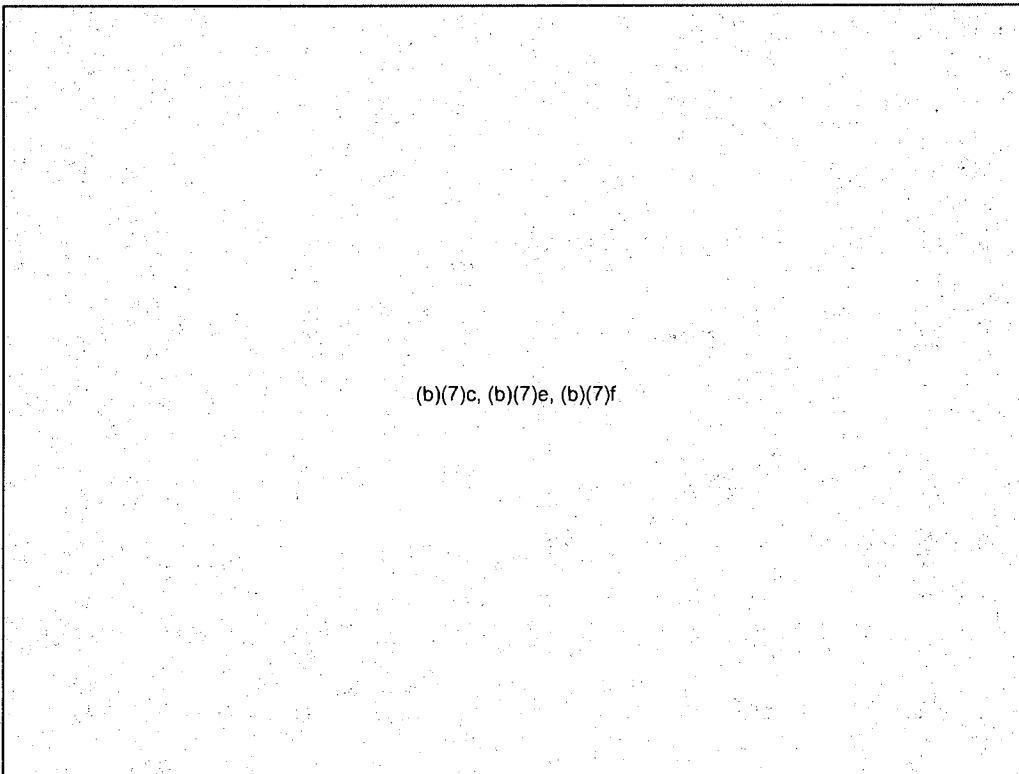



A Systems Approach to Energy Efficiency

THE PRESIDENT HAS SEEN

Efficient motor systems can greatly impact manufacturing operations, from enhancing control over production processes to reducing wastes and improving environmental performance.

Significant amounts of energy can be saved by varying the speed of the pump to control flow. In conventional pumping systems, motors are run at constant speed and valves are used to restrict flow—forcing the motor and pump to work against the valve. Adjustable speed drive technology changes the speed of the motor itself to match the flow requirements—avoiding the energy losses of throttling valves. This “systems approach” provides significant energy savings and improves control of the production process.

The demonstration system includes a NEMA premium efficiency motor, adjustable speed control, and a centrifugal pump.

- Open valve at 100% flow uses 100% of system power
- Throttled valve at 80% flow uses 95% of system power
- Open valve and 80% flow controlled under adjustable speed drive uses 62% of system power, saving 35% of the power used in the throttled system.

Significant savings can be realized by using these adjustable speed electronic drive and other technologies in an integrated systems approach.

- Implementation of *all* well-established motor system energy efficiency measures and practices that meet reasonable investment criteria under (3 year payback) will yield annual energy savings of 75 to 122 billion kWh, with a value of \$3.6 - \$5.8 billion at 1997 industrial energy prices of \$0.048/kWh (EIA 1997).
- Over half of all electricity sold in the U.S. industrial sector is used for electric motor-driven systems. Overall, motor systems are the largest end users of electricity in the U.S. economy.
